A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Article 2 of Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated,
- 2 relating to physicians, so as to authorize the use of influenza vaccine orders for a group of
- 3 patients; to provide for influenza vaccine protocol agreements between physicians and
- 4 pharmacists or nurses; to provide for definitions; to provide requirements for the content of
- 5 influenza vaccine protocol agreements; to provide that a party to an influenza vaccine
- 6 protocol agreement shall not delegate his or her authority; to provide for statutory
- 7 construction; to provide for policies for handling used equipment; to limit the number of
- 8 influenza vaccine protocol agreements in which a physician may enter at any one time; to
- 9 prohibit certain entities from entering into influenza vaccine protocol agreements; to provide
- 10 for rules and regulations; to provide for limited liability; to provide for applicability; to
- provide for related matters; to provide for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and
- 12 for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- SECTION 1.
- 15 Article 2 of Chapter 34 of Title 43 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 16 physicians, is amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 17 "43-34-26.4.
- 18 (a) As used in this Code section, the term:
- (1) 'Administer' means the provision of a unit dose of influenza vaccine by a pharmacist
- 20 <u>or nurse pursuant to an influenza vaccine order contained in an influenza vaccine protocol</u>
- agreement with a physician.
- 22 (2) 'Adverse event' means an event that is a negative consequence of the administration
- of influenza vaccine by a pharmacist or nurse that results in an unintended reaction,
- injury, or illness, which may or may not have been preventable.
- 25 (3) 'Board' means the Composite State Board of Medical Examiners.

(4) 'Influenza vaccine' means a vaccine administered by injection that contains

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27 inactivated influenza viruses that is prepared for the applicable season and that is 28 administered to produce or increase immunity to the influenza virus. 29 (5) 'Influenza vaccine order' means a prescription drug order, contained in an influenza 30 vaccine protocol agreement, for influenza vaccine issued by a physician for a group of 31 patients that meet a certain criteria and to be administered by a pharmacist or a nurse. An 32 influenza vaccine order shall also mean a prescription drug order, contained in an 33 influenza vaccine protocol agreement, for epinephrine issued by a physician for a group 34 of patients that meet a certain criteria and to be administered by a pharmacist or a nurse 35 only upon the occurrence of an actual or perceived anaphylactic adverse reaction to the 36 administered influenza vaccine provided that the influenza vaccine protocol agreement 37 sets forth the signs and symptoms that warrant the administration of epinephrine. 38 (6) 'Influenza vaccine protocol agreement' means a written document mutually agreed 39 upon and signed by a physician and a pharmacist or by a physician and a nurse, by which 40 document the physician prescribes influenza vaccine and epinephrine, if determined 41 appropriate by the physician, by means of an influenza vaccine order for administration 42 by a pharmacist or a nurse. 43 (7) 'Nurse' means a registered professional nurse as defined in paragraph (9) of Code 44 Section 43-26-3. 45 (8) 'Pharmacist' means an individual licensed under Chapter 4 of Title 26 to engage in 46 the practice of pharmacy in the State of Georgia. 47 (9) 'Pharmacy intern' means a pharmacy intern as defined in paragraph (19) of Code 48 Section 26-4-5. 49 (10) 'Physician' means an individual licensed to practice medicine and surgery pursuant 50 to this article and whose principal place of practice is located in this state. 51 (b) A physician engaged in the active practice of medicine may prescribe influenza 52 vaccine for a group of patients via an influenza vaccine order contained in an influenza 53 vaccine protocol agreement to be administered by a pharmacist, provided the physician is registered with the vaccination registry established by the Department of Human Resources 54 55 pursuant to Code Section 31-12-3.1, commonly known as the Georgia Registry of 56 Immunization Transactions and Services, the pharmacist is located within the county of the 57 physician's place of registration with the vaccination registry or a county contiguous thereto, and the pharmacist holds current certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support and 58 59 has completed a course of training accredited by the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy 60 Education or similar health authority or professional body approved by the Georgia State 61 Board of Pharmacy. A physician who is a party to an influenza vaccine protocol agreement 62 may also prescribe epinephrine via an influenza vaccine order contained in an influenza

63	vaccine protocol agreement for administration by a pharmacist upon the occurrence of an
64	actual or perceived anaphylactic adverse reaction to the administered influenza vaccine
65	provided that the influenza vaccine protocol agreement sets forth the signs and symptoms
66	that warrant the administration of epinephrine.
67	(c) A physician engaged in the active practice of medicine may prescribe influenza vaccine
68	for a group of patients via an influenza vaccine order contained in an influenza vaccine
69	protocol agreement to be administered by a nurse, provided the physician is registered the
70	vaccination registry established by the Department of Human Resources pursuant to Code
71	Section 31-12-3.1, commonly known as the Georgia Registry of Immunization
72	Transactions and Services, the nurse is located within the county of the physician's place
73	of registration with the vaccination registry or a county contiguous thereto, and the nurse
74	holds current certification in Basic Cardiac Life Support. A physician who is a party to an
75	influenza vaccine protocol agreement may also prescribe epinephrine via an influenza
76	vaccine order contained in an influenza vaccine protocol agreement for administration by
77	a nurse upon the occurrence of an actual or perceived anaphylactic adverse reaction to the
78	administered influenza vaccine provided that the influenza vaccine protocol agreement sets
79	forth the signs and symptoms that warrant the administration of epinephrine.
80	(d) An influenza vaccine protocol agreement between a physician and a pharmacist or a
81	physician and a nurse pursuant to this Code section shall, without limitation:
82	(1) Contain the current names, addresses, telephone numbers, and professional license
83	numbers of the physician and the pharmacist or nurse;
84	(2) Contain a provision for immediate consultation between the pharmacist or nurse and
85	the physician. If the physician is not available, the physician for purposes of consultation
86	may designate another physician who concurs with the terms of the influenza vaccine
87	protocol agreement;
88	(3) Require the pharmacist or nurse to provide the influenza vaccine recipient with the
89	appropriate and current Vaccine Information Statement (VIS) as provided by the federal
90	Centers for Disease Control and Prevention;
91	(4) Require the pharmacist or nurse or his or her employer to retain documentation of
92	each dose of influenza vaccine administered. Such documentation shall include, but not
93	be limited to:
94	(A) The administering pharmacist's or nurse's name, address, telephone number, and
95	professional license number;
96	(B) The name, dose, manufacturer, and lot number of the influenza vaccine;
97	(C) The vaccine recipient's name, address, date of birth, and telephone number;
98	(D) The date of administration and injection site:

99	(E) A signed and dated consent form by which the vaccine recipient acknowledges
100	receipt of the VIS and consents to the administration of the influenza vaccine; and
101	(F) Any adverse events or complications that occur;
102	(5) Require the pharmacist or nurse to enter the patient's influenza vaccine information
103	in the Georgia Registry of Immunization Transactions and Services within the registry's
104	designated time frame, or as designated by the Department of Human Resources;
105	(6) Require, as a condition of administration of the influenza vaccine, the influenza
106	vaccine recipient to remain under the observation of the administering pharmacist or
107	nurse for a period of not less than 15 minutes immediately subsequent to the
108	administration of the influenza vaccine;
109	(7) Contain procedures to follow up on the occurrence of an adverse event or
110	complication including, if prescribed via an influenza vaccine order contained in an
111	influenza vaccine protocol agreement, the administration of epinephrine;
112	(8) Provide for prioritization of influenza vaccine recipients in the event the supply of
113	influenza vaccine is limited; and
114	(9) Be renewed and, if necessary, revised or updated biennially by the physician and the
115	pharmacist or nurse. An influenza vaccine protocol agreement that is not renewed
116	biennially shall expire.
117	(e) A pharmacist that is a party to an influenza vaccine protocol agreement pursuant to this
118	Code section shall not delegate the administration of influenza vaccine to any individual
119	other than a pharmacy intern under the direct supervision of the pharmacist whether or not
120	any such other individual is under the supervision, direct or otherwise, of the pharmacist.
121	(f) A nurse that is a party to an influenza vaccine protocol agreement pursuant to this Code
122	section shall not delegate the administration of influenza vaccine to any individual, whether
123	or not any such individual is under the supervision, direct or otherwise, of the nurse;
124	provided, however, that a nurse that is a party to an influenza protocol agreement pursuant
125	to this Code section may delegate the administration of influenza vaccine to a licensed
126	practical nurse under the direct on-site supervision of the nurse.
127	(g) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a nurse acting pursuant to an influenza
128	vaccine protocol agreement as provided in this Code section may possess and transport
129	influenza vaccine and epinephrine.
130	(h) A pharmacist or nurse administering influenza vaccines pursuant to an influenza
131	vaccine protocol agreement authorized by this Code section shall maintain policies and
132	procedures for the handling and disposal of used or contaminated equipment and supplies.
133	(i) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to authorize a physician to prescribe
134	any vaccines or other drugs pursuant to an influenza vaccine protocol agreement or

135 influenza vaccine order contained in an influenza vaccine protocol agreement other than 136 influenza vaccines and epinephrine. 137 (j) A delegating physician may not enter into an influenza vaccine protocol agreement with 138 more than ten pharmacists or nurses, or any combination thereof, at any one time; provided, 139 however, and notwithstanding subsections (b) and (c) of this Code section, a delegating 140 physician may enter into an influenza vaccine protocol agreement with more than ten 141 pharmacists or nurses, or any combination thereof, at any one time so long as the 142 pharmacists or nurses are in the same public health district as established pursuant to Code 143 Section 31-3-15, and are employees or agents of the same corporate entity. 144 (k) It shall be unlawful for a physician who is employed by a pharmacist or nurse to enter 145 into an influenza vaccine protocol agreement or otherwise delegate medical acts to such 146 pharmacist or nurse. It shall be unlawful for a physician who is employed by a pharmacy 147 to enter into an influenza vaccine protocol agreement or otherwise delegate medical acts 148 to a pharmacist or nurse who is also employed by such pharmacy. 149 (1) The board shall have the authority to promulgate rules and regulations governing a 150 physician who is a party to an influenza vaccine protocol agreement in order to carry out the intent and purposes of this Code section. Further, the board shall: 151 152 (1) Require that the influenza vaccine protocol agreement be filed by the physician with 153 the board and be made available by the board for public inspection; and 154 (2) Promulgate by rule an approved standard protocol template that may be utilized as 155 an influenza vaccine protocol agreement and make such template available on the board's 156 website. 157 (m) Nothing in this Code section shall be construed to require a physician to enter into an 158 influenza vaccine protocol agreement. A public or private managed care system, health 159 plan, hospital, insurance company, or similar entity shall not require a physician, 160 pharmacist, or nurse to enter into an influenza vaccine protocol agreement as a condition 161 for participation in or reimbursement from such entity. (n) No physician who complies with the provisions of this Code section shall be subject 162 to criminal or civil liability or discipline for unprofessional conduct for, including but not 163 164 limited to, entering into an influenza vaccine protocol agreement, issuing an influenza 165 vaccine order contained in an influenza vaccine protocol agreement, or for the acts or omissions of a pharmacist or nurse pursuant to an influenza vaccine protocol agreement 166 including the administration of influenza vaccine or epinephrine. 167 (o) This Code section shall not apply to any activities conducted within a hospital or 168 169 within any other facility or entity owned, operated, or leased by a hospital. 170 (p) This Code section shall not be interpreted as limiting the authority of any authorized 171 person to dispense or administer influenza vaccine or other medications."

172 **SECTION 2.**

- 173 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 174 without such approval.

175 **SECTION 3.**

176 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
